Our Home/School Partnership Agreement Policy is an attempt to build up that support by stating clearly the role of each partner.

**Ilchester Community Primary School will:**

- encourage every child to achieve his or her best in all aspects of school life;
- provide stimulating and challenging learning opportunities;
- strive for high standards of work and behaviour through building good relationships and developing a sense of responsibility and accountability;
- offer opportunities for learning out of the classroom, including setting and monitoring of homework;
- value effort;
- inform you about our programmes of study;
- give you regular updates of your child's progress and inform you of any concerns;
- provide a caring and safe school environment;
- respect all pupils as individuals, recognising their rights of equality;
- encourage your child to be a caring and considerate member of the school;
- deal promptly with all matters involving anti-social behaviour and, in particular, incidences of bullying;
- be welcoming at all times and provide opportunities for parents to become involved in the daily life of the school;
- keep parents informed about general school matters;
- respond to your concerns and questions as promptly as possible;
- endeavour to provide a range of extra activities, which may involve your child representing Ilchester Community Primary School.

### **As a parent or carer I will:**

- ensure my child attends school regularly, in time and properly equipped;
- comply with the school's uniform code;
- provide suitable P.E. kit;
- encourage my child to achieve his or her best in all aspects of school life;
- for reasons of safety and security, I will ensure my child does not wear unnecessary jewellery;
- contact the school promptly and provide an explanation if my child is absent;
- provide a nutritious and sufficient school lunch, unless provided by the school meals service;
- inform the school about any concerns which might affect my child's behaviour, progress or attendance;
- attend consultation evenings to discuss my child's progress;
- to the best of my ability, support my child in homework and ensure that it is completed on time. I will listen to my child read on a regular basis;
- appreciate the extra curricular activities are a privilege and will support them accordingly;
- support the school's policies and the code of conduct on behaviour;
- endeavour to arrange our annual family holiday outside school terms.

**As a pupil I will:**

- come to school regularly, on time and wearing school uniform;
- bring my P.E. kit on the appropriate days and wear it;
- not wear unnecessary jewellery;
- take responsibility for my personal possessions;
- try my best in everything I do;
- keep the school rules and classroom agreements;
- read regularly and complete homework on time;
- eat my lunch and use good table manners;
- be polite, caring and respectful of all adults and all children;
- take good care of our school;
- represent my school with enthusiasm, commitment, and my best behaviour;
- be honest and truthful.
