PE and Sports Grant Statement: Academic Year 2017/2018

PE and Sports Grant

The government provides additional funding to primary schools to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on the provision of PE and sport in schools.

Purpose of funding

Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but schools have been given the freedom to choose how they do this.

Aims 2017- 2018

- To improve numbers of children participating in sport and activity, specifically to target children through the 'Change For Life' program
- To repair the school swimming pool facility to as to ensure that children form KS1 have the opportunity to swim
- To establish a MUGA sink fund to offset any shortfall from lettings so as to maintain this facility
- To promote greater levels of activity at lunchtime

Planned Spending 2017/2018

The current budget (April 2018) has allocated £18151 towards developing school sport and PE. The school plans to spend the money as set out below:

Sports Teaching Assistant £7,148

Swimming £500

Yeovil Games Association £300

Play equipment inspection £116

Lunchtime Activity Leaders: both sites £4,728

Development & Training £600

Sports Grounds marking £250

Travel expenses sports £100

MUGA Sink Fund £4,409

Review of 2016/2017

Last year (2016/2017) Ilchester Community Primary School used the money to:

- help employ specialist coaches to work with children in school and to host after school football sessions
- employ a member of our own staff to organise and attend extra-curricular sports activities
- improve resources to support the development of the subject
- subsidise transport to and from the swimming pool
- help provide staffing for a residential outdoor pursuits activity residential
- purchase equipment to promote accessible playground activity

Impact:

- more than 1500 hours of extra-curricular sport enjoyed by children at Ilchester
- all children from Reception to Year6 had access to a trained sports coach for their PE sessions
- all children from years 3-6 had the opportunity to swim at a full size swimming pool with a qualified coach
- attendance at accessible sporting events and in-school facilities enhanced (Boccia County finals/ Seated Volleyball area competition)
- all children included on the outdoor pursuits residential
- PE and after school sessions improved through better equipment.
