

English

- Apply phonic knowledge and skills to decode words.
- Writing simple sentences using capital letters and full stops.
- Extend a sentence using 'and'.
- Looking at poetry, information texts and stories.
- Spelling common exception words correctly.
- Looking at spelling rules such as plurals, suffixes, prefixes etc.

Maths

- Place value and reasoning about numbers (within 100).
- Addition/subtraction, including using inverse operations and missing numbers.
- Multiplication and division including counting in 2s, 5s and 10s.
- Fractions - $\frac{1}{2}$ and $\frac{1}{4}$.
- Geometry - position and direction.
- Telling time to hour and half hour.
- Money - making amounts and working out change.
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Science

- How to stay healthy - hygiene and diet.

Geography

- Recapping continents and oceans.
- Map skills - routes, keys, symbols, simple grid references, compass points.
- Create our own treasure maps.



History

- History of pirates and ships. Looking at famous pirates - Blackbeard and Anne Bonny in literacy.

To find out about pirates. To develop map and art skills through seascape paintings. Our topic will start off with a treasure hunt!

Home Learning

Daily Reading - We expect children to read 5x a week at home. Home reading is vital to help your child make progress. We will check reading diaries at least 3x a week and change books when appropriate.

It is important to not only read the book but to ask your child questions about what they have read to draw out their understanding and comprehension. There is a huge emphasis on reading comprehension in year 2.

Occasionally we may send home some additional keywords or phonic packs to support your child.
