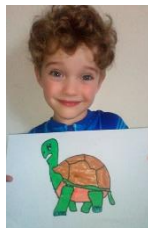

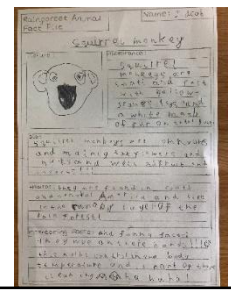

We appreciate that some children are reading other books at home which we encourage in addition to using Bug Club but we would still like them to read the scheme books too.
